Monthly Message from the Principal

Dear South Families,

I hope you all enjoyed your holiday and school vacation. My wish is that it was free from the stress of computers and Google anything. Personally, I am looking forward to more normalcy in 2021 and saying good riddance to 2020 and all things Covid-related. I know it hasn't been easy for anyone.

Snow season is upon us. Outside recess will happen as long as the temperature is 22 degrees with wind chill. Please send your child to school with snow boots, cold weather coats and hats, as well as hats and gloves/mittens. Students can play in the snow if they are dressed appropriately.

As the new year begins, people usually talk about goals. The same can be done with the children in school. Many teachers have their students set goals and reflect on what the students do well and what they need to do better. We all have things that are strengths and weaknesses, adults and children. Talking about your own goals and things you may want to improve on with your child is helpful. "Hopes and Dreams" is an activity done in many classes at the beginning of each school year and often again in January. You can do this with your child, too. Maybe inquire about a work habit or Social Emotional skill in a non-judgmental way: How can you make the morning routine run smoother? (go to bed earlier, pack their backpack or set out clothes to wear the night before.) What do you think you could do to help you solve that problem with your friend? (take turns, use your words, tell them how you feel, compromise, etc.). With holiday family gatherings past us, we are anticipating an increase in calls about close contacts, and quarantines. At the same time, I know it places a burden on families because of childcare and work. If your child has any of the following symptoms, PLEASE do not send your child to school. If you feel that your child needs medication in the morning, this is an indication that your child needs to remain home from school and please communicate this with us. Thank you for your cooperation in this very important matter.

- Fever (100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher), chills, or
- shaking chills
- · Cough (not due to other known cause, such as chronic cough)
- · Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- · New loss of taste or smell
- · Sore throat
- · Headache, when in combination with other symptoms
- Muscle Aches or body aches
- · Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- · Fatigue, when in combination of other symptoms
- Nasal Congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies) when in combination with other symptoms



This month we have been building upon our beginning reading skills by separating words into syllables and learning our first vowel sound, /a/. We have been using this vowel to build and read CVC words (consonant-vowel-consonant). We introduce this skill by creating word families where we change the beginning sound of a chunk (like -at) to create new words (cat, hat, mat). In science we have been talking about air temperature and how the sun warms the air and earth. We will begin a new science unit in January about Living Things. We ended December by sharing how our families celebrate different holidays! We hope everyone has a fun and relaxing vacation and we can't wait to continue our growth as readers and writers in the new year!
