**Google Classroom:** It may be helpful to download the GOOGLE Classroom App on your cell phone. Please click <u>HERE</u> for instructions. As a guardian, you can receive email summaries showing your student's progress in classroom:

- Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or work that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails)
- Class activity—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers



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## KINDERGARTEN

#### <u>October</u>

Kindergarten has been very busy this month learning letters, sounds, and sight words. We are building our knowledge of these concepts to help us be stronger readers and writers. Students have been learning how to read books by looking at the pictures to read the story and by pointing to words in leveled sight word texts. Our focus has also been on identifying the title, characters, settings, and events from a story. Students have also begun sounding out words to create "Kid Writing." They begin by drawing a story from their life and then they write the letters for the sounds that they hear in each word of the sentence. In science we have been learning about the daytime and nighttime sky as well as different ways to describe the weather. In math we have begun our chapter on identifying counting, and writing the numbers 0-5. We will be sending home a fun family project next week to get ready for Thanksgiving, be on the lookout for it!!

## **GRADE TWO**

Our SEL focus has been building our "Calming Corner" together! Each week we are adding yoga poses, breathing techniques, and growth mindset posters. In ELA, we have finished our second story, Snowshoe Hare's Winter Home, with it's focus on using the illustrations to help tell a story. We have continued our narrative writing with strong character and setting descriptions and sequenced events. Word work has focused on the CVCe long vowel pattern. In math, we have learned to show numbers in a variety of ways including quick pictures, digits, tens/ones, expanded form, and number words. In social studies, we are learning the difference between a globe and a map, cardinal directions on a compass rose, and map keys and symbols. Science will be a focused study of planet Earth and Earth materials! We even squeezed in a small Character Day/October celebration!!
